1 General

This Release Notice is a summary of the major extensions, dependencies and op*C erating information with respect to WebTransactions for OSD (Linux systems)
7.5C under Linux operating system that are not included in the Product Facts and in the manuals.

WebTransactions for OSD is a product for Web-enabling BS2000 interactive applications to the World Wide Web (WWW). The product contains a terminal emulator which operates like a 9750 or 9763 terminal. With the aid of a standard template, the application interface is converted one-to-one to HTML. For the optical design of the application interface there are two methods available. A layout which applies to the entire application can be achieved by modifying the standard templates. An individual layout for individual screens can be achieved using a special capture technique. "Snapshots" of the screens are stored and converted to corresponding templates, which can also be individually structured. With the functions for dialog reengineering, dialog sequences can be combined or separated and therefore restructured more ergonomically without having to modify the logic or the data structures of the underlying host application. The user friendly development environment WebLab is at your disposal for all development steps.

3.1 Resource requirements

Required disk space: 30 MB Required virtual memory: 64 MB - Additionally per concurrent user: >5 MB

3.2 Software configuration

- *C WebTransactions for OSD (Linux systems) 7.5C is released for use on servers with:
- *C SUSE Linux Enterprise Server as of 11/12/15 (SLES11/12/15)
- *C Red Hat Enterprise Linux as of release 6/7/8 (RHEL6/7/8)

Further software prerequisites:

- A WWW server with CGI and/or ISAPI interface.
- Access to the host via TCP/IP

For automatic mask conversion:

- IFG as of V8.3A (IFG works on any server with BS2000)
- A product for the transfer of binary coded data between Linux and BS2000 (e.g. ftp or openFT)

For individual user exits:

For Java integration (optional):

A 32-bit Java runtime system is needed on 64-bit Linux installations.

Ordering the activation key:

A license key is required in order to set up the licenses. Start the WebTransactions Administration, select Licenses and follow the instructions.

3.3.2 Notes on Web-Server

The WWW server used for WebTransactions applications needs write access right to the installation folder of WebTransactions, the subdirectory webtav75 in the document root areas of the WWW server and to all base directories which should be created.

Using Apache servers "Options Indexes FollowSymLinks" must be set for document root area of the WWW server.

3.3.3 Notes on deinstallation

All administration settings are retained during deinstallation. This concerns the files within <install>/config/wtaccess (containing administration data for managing identification, access and applications) as well as all files for cluster <install>/config/cluster/*. If necessary delete these files after the deinstallation.

Deinstallation of WebTransactions is not available for Linux. To remove all installed products of WebTransactions, please erase all data of the WebTransactions installations folder (Default: /opt/WebTrans/7.5).

WebLab/external HTML editors:

If you want to use an external HTML editor, please make sure that the editor is compatible with the templates of WebTransactions. In general, when working with external HTML editors you must not use nested wt-tags.

Web browsers:

In order to use Mozilla Firefox as browser for sessions started by WebLab, enter the application name "firefox" in the WebLab menu

Options/Preferences/Programs. Using Mozilla Firefox the maximum length for a valid URL may be exceeded. To avoid this, create base directories with shortest path names as possible.

Java:

If an output is sent to java.lang. System. out and the trace of WebTransactions is switched on, this output will be sent to stderr instead of stdout.

If following error occurs during initialization of the Java Virtual Machine "Error occurred during initialization of VM. Signal chaining not allowed for VM interrupt signal, try -XX:+UseAltSigs.", before the first java call (x=new WT_JAVA.....).the option '-XX:+UseAltSigs' must be set.

It must be set either new for example with "WT_SYSTEM.JAVA_OPTIONS=new Array ('-XX:+UseAltSigs');", or existing options must be extended.

- Files in the folder diagnosis in WebTransactions installation folder, if they exist.
- System dumps / cores (if available)
- System traces (if available)
- Wtgate traces (if available)
