1 General

This Release Notice is a summary of the major extensions, dependencies and op-*C erating information with respect to WebTransactions for openUTM (Windows) 7.5C under the Windows operating system that are not included in the Product Facts and in the manuals.

You can use WebTransactions for openUTM to link existing openUTM applications into the World Wide Web (WWW). You also have the option of retaining existing masks after conversion or optimizing the user interface and dialog sequence of your application for the WWW by programming HTML templates. You can also create a new HTML user interface for new applications to allow the user to control the application and data output with a WWW browser. WebTransactions is also suitable for client/server applications, acting as the link between the server application and the client browser.

With the functions for dialog reengineering, dialog sequences can be combined or separated and therefore restructured more ergonomically without having to modify the logic or the data structures of the underlying host application.

The user friendly development environment WebLab is at your disposal for all development steps.

2 Software extensions

Only the extensions and improvements over the previous version WebTransactions for openUTM (Windows) V7.5B are described in the following section.

3.1 Resource requirements

Required disk space: 35 MB Required virtual memory: 64 MB - Additionally per concurrent user: >5 MB

3.2 Software configuration

- *C WebTransactions for openUTM (Windows) V7.5C is released for use on servers with:
 - Windows Server 2012 R2
- *C Windows Server 2016
- *C Windows Server 2019

Further software prerequisites:

- A WWW server with CGI and/or ISAPI interface.

For automatic mask conversion:

- IFG V8.3A (IFG works on any server with BS2000)
- A product for the transfer of binary coded data between Windows and BS2000 (e.g. ftp or openFT)

For individual user exits:

- A development environment for creating a Windows DLL

For Java integration (optional):

*C - JAVA as of V1.6

Requirements concerning the application to be linked in:

- The application must run under openUTM as of V6.4

3.3 Product installation

Installation is described in chapter 2 of manual "Connection to openUTM Applications via UPIC"

3.3.1 General notes

For successful installation the WebTransactions installer must be started under the Administrator account with the UAC (User Account Control) system off.

WebLab:

- *C WebTransactions WebLab (Windows) V7.5C runs on all systems, including
- *C servers supported by 8.1/10, Windows Server 2012R2/2016/2019 after down-
- *C load via web browser.

The file WebLab75.msi is stored in subdirectory webtav75 in the document root directory of the Web-Server.

Ordering the activation key:

A license key is required in order to set up the licenses. Start the WebTransactions Administration, select Licenses and follow the instructions.

3.3.2 Notes on Web-Server

The WWW server used for WebTransactions applications needs write access right to the installation folder of WebTransactions, the subdirectory webtav75 in the document root areas of the WWW server and to all base directories which should be created.

Using Apache servers "Options Indexes FollowSymLinks" must be set for document root area of the WWW server.

The installation folder of WebTransactions contains:

- executable files which need the right for execution (e.g..: <install>\lib\WTHolder.exe)
- configuration files which are read and written (e.g..: <install>\config\wtaccess)
- folders in which files and subfolders can be created, read, written and deleted (e.g.: <install>\admin\tmp)

^(*) Only if you have installed the demos (JavaDemo, PortalDemo, ShoppingDemo). Full access is needed for files and subfolders.

To prevent security risks the demos should be installed in test environment only.

3.3.3 Notes on deinstallation

All administration settings are retained during deinstallation. This concerns the files within <install>/config/wtaccess (containing administration data for managing identification, access and applications) as well as all files for cluster <install>/config/cluster/*. If necessary delete these files after the deinstallation.

When full deinstallation is required, the WiX installer allows to remove all to WebTransactions connected files automatically. To do this, start the WebTransactions MSI installer and select the "Remove All" option for full deinstallation of WebTransactions.

3.4 Product use

WebTransactions for openUTM cannot be used for applications which work with FHS-DE (Dialog Extension). Please use WebTransactions for OSD instead.

WebTransactions for openUTM does not support so called "-" (minus) formats. Please use WebTransactions for OSD instead. Line-mode messages will be supported.

If WebTransactions is to be used with Microsoft Internet Information Server and there are more than approx. 60 parallel users, the setting of the desktop heap for non-interactive Windows stations must be increased. To do this use regedit and change in HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Control\Session Manager\SubSystems\Windows the value <zzzz> of SharedSection=<xxxx>,<yyyy>,<zzzz> (generally 512 or possibly missing) to the new value 4096. After this restart the server. Please note that Microsoft points out, that problems due to a wrong use of the registry editor possibly cannot be repaired.

Not terminated sessions can be terminated via the WebTransactions administration. Don't terminate sessions via the windows task manager, because in this case session related files would not be removed.

WebLab/external HTML editors:

If you want to use an external HTML editor, please make sure that the editor is compatible with the templates of WebTransactions. In general, when working with external HTML editors you must not use nested wt-tags.

Web browsers:

In order to use Mozilla Firefox as browser for sessions started by WebLab, enter the application name "firefox" in the WebLab menu

Options/Preferences/Programs. Using Mozilla Firefox the maximum length for a valid URL may be exceeded. To avoid this, create base directories with shortest path names as possible.

Java:

If an output is sent to java.lang. System. out and the trace of WebTransactions is switched on, this output will be sent to stderr instead of stdout.

If following error occurs during initialization of the Java Virtual Machine "Error occurred during initialization of VM. Signal chaining not allowed for VM interrupt signal, try -XX:+UseAltSigs.", before the first java call (x=new WT_JAVA.....).the option '-XX:+UseAltSigs' must be set. It must be set either new for example with "WT_SYSTEM.JAVA_OPTIONS=new Array ('-XX:+UseAltSigs');", or existing options must be extended.

If an error occurs, the following error documents are needed for diagnostics:

- Test case scenario (A detailed description of the error condition, indicating whether and how the error can be reproduced)
- Templates and field files
- Holder-Trace (activated e.g. via WebLab)
- Recording of the host-communication (Emulation trace)

- UPIC trace
- Files in the folder diagnosis in WebTransactions installation folder, if they exist.
- System dumps / cores (if available)
- System traces (if available)
- Wtgate traces (if available)
