LMS (Library Maintenance System) is the central library management system with which BS2000 creates and administers libraries and also processes the elements they contain.

2 Software extensions

Statement EDIT-ELEMENT

The statement //EDIT-ELEMENT has now an additional alias called EDIT.

*03 Store file CHANGE-DATE as element USER-DATE

*03 The operand USER-DATE of the statement //ADD-ELEMENT has a new value
*03 *BY-SOURCE to take the USER-DATE/TIME of the target element from
*03 the CHANGE-DATE/TIME of the source file.

Support of Last Byte Pointer

The Last Byte Pointer (LBP) of PAM files is preserved if the file is added with //ADD-ELEMENT to a library. //EXTRACT-ELEMENT restores the LBP of those files.

*02 The output of the statement //SHOW-ELEMENT was extended by LBP
*02 information.

File attributes of elements from type C

Optionally it is now possible to preserve the file attributes of elements from type C as well. To do so the statements //ADD-ELEMENT and //MOD-LMS-DEFAULTS has been extended. The value *KEEP of the operand SOURCE-ATTRIBUTES within the structure ELEMENT-ATTRIBUTES is extended by the sub-structure KEEP-TYPES. This is important to preserve a LBP of files from type C.

Statement SHOW-LMS-DEFAULT

The clearness of nested values within the output is improved by indentations.

*03 **Support of SAM Node Files**

*03 The statements //ADD-ELEMENT and //EXTRACT-ELEMENT can store and
*03 restore SAM node files. The net coded character set name (NETCCSN) is
*03 preserved if the file is added to a library with //ADD-ELEMENT ...SOURCE-
*03 ATTRIBUTES=*KEEP. //EXTRACT-ELEMENT restores the NETCCSN of
*03 those SAM node files if file attributes are taken from the member.
*03 The output of the statement //SHOW-ELEMENT was extended by
*03 NETCCSN information.

*04 **Statement SHOW-ELEMENT-ATTRIBUTES**

*04 If the members have the attribute DESTROY-DATA=*YES, the output of the
*04 statement //SHOW-ELEMENT-ATTRIBUTES was extended by DESTROY-
*04 DATA information in the SECURITY block.

*04 The statement //SHOW-ELEMENT-ATTRIBUTES with operand
*04 INFORMATION=*DELTA-STRUCTURE can generate structured output to a
*04 variable now.

*05 The statements //ADD-ELEMENT can add files with format PAM LLM to a
*05 library and //EXTRACT-ELEMENT can extract elements from a library to files

3 Technical information

3.1 Resource requirements

At least 2.2 MB is required for loading LMSSDF in user address space.

Preloading the subsystem occupies 1.2 MB in class 4 memory and 1.2 MB (private part) in user address space.

The memory requirement is a minimum value that may increase depending on the amount of data and application.

3.2 Software configuration

3.3 Product installation

Installation of the product LMS with the IMON installation monitor is mandatory. You must follow the information concerning installation in the delivery cover letter and in the product documentation as well as the information in this Release Notice.

Before calling IMON, you must carry out the actions listed in the delivery cover letter as installation requirements.

After these actions have been executed you have to install the product with IMON. The necessary inputs and the sequence of the installation are described in the IMON documentation.

After successful installation of the product with IMON you have to carry out the following actions:

In the case of applications that explicitly require the existence of the file \$TSOS.LMSLIB, one of the following alternatives can be used as a workaround:

- a) The application can be patched so that \$.LMSLIB is required.
The alias catalog redirection from SYSACF.LMS.035 then redirects accesses to SYSLNK.LMS.035.
- b) SYSLNK.LMS.035 can be copied to \$TSOS.LMSLIB.
If this method is used, note that the copy operation must be repeated after every correction applied to SYSLNK.LMS.035.

3.6 Incompatibilities

Statement FIND-ELEMENT

Some incorrect regular expressions (e.g. containing multiple consecutive duplication symbols) which were accepted as search pattern so far are now rejected with message LMS0298.

File attributes of elements from type C and R

*02 Optionally elements of type C and R can be created with an attribute record
*02 (record type 164) as well by using "SOURCE-ATTRIBUTES=*KEEP(KEEP-
 TYPES=*ALL)". Please note that LMS versions less than V3.4C can't extract
 those elements correctly. Message LMS0169 may occur.

*01 Outputting members to a file

*01 Please note that if LBP is stored when adding a member, the member can't be
*01 extracted to a tape or private disk.
*01

*01 If in such a case the LBP is not needed for further processing, output the
*01 member to a pubset, reset the LBP by the command
*01 /MODIFY-FILE-ATTRIBUTES RESET-LBP=*YES, and copy the file further on to
*01 tape or private disk.

- library to reproduce the error
