2 Notes on product use

2.1 Software/hardware configuration

2.1.1 Operating system

The following operating system versions are required for using
SMAWpcmX (Solaris-Sparc) V6.0:

```
-----  
Operating System | Version  
-----  
Solaris sparc    | from 5.9  
-----
```

2.2 Resource requirements

SMAWpcmX V6.0A requires the following hard disk space:

```
-----  
Package          | /etc | /opt  
-----  
SMAWpcmX (Sparc) | ~4 KB | ~1,5 MB

```

Main memory requirement of the ICMX(L) library:

```
-----  
Text    | Initialized | Not initialized  
segment | data/processes | (bss) data/processes

~300 KB | ~10 KB      | ~72 KB

```

The ICMX library is a "shared library". The text segment therefore
is present only once in the main memory.

2.3 Product installation/configuration

2.3.1 Installing SMAWpcmX(Solaris)

SMAWpcmX (Solaris) is shipped as a package and must be installed
with pkgadd.

The description contains the <package> for the SMAWpcmx (Solaris-Sparc) package that you received (for example, SMAWpcmx.stream). If you renamed the package, you must use the new file name.

For an installation or update, root rights are required.

New installation:

```
pkgadd -d `pwd`/<package>
```

Update from an earlier version is unfortunately not possible as the package name has changed.

Please uninstall the old package first and then install the new package

2.3.2 Uninstalling SMAWpcmx(Solaris)

Determine the name of the installed SMAWpcmx (Solaris) package (CMX or PCMX) using pkginfo and uninstall those products as required.

Uninstalling command:

```
pkgrm <package>
```

2.4.1 Limit values

Max. number of ICMX applications per processes	1024
Max. number of TVs (TCEPs) per ICMX application	1024
Max. number of RFC1006 connections per ICMX application	1024

2.6.1 Source programs

The CMX library is available as a shared object. This means that your programs will automatically use the new CMX library without having to be relinked after a new CMX version has been installed.

2.9.1 New functions

IPv6:

The extended addressing over the IPv6 stack is supported.

Multithreaded functions:

The CMX-lib is thread save since the version 6.0. The calls to the CMX-lib can be made from different, maybe competing threads. For it is necessary to use the CMX-functions of the library libpthreadcmx.so when creating applications.

3 Changes to previous PCMX Version

3.1 Connection to the own Process

Connections can be set up to the own process.

3.2 TNS-Tools tnsxdel and tnsxnames

This two CMX tools are now deployed with by PCMX. They are documented in CMX manuals.

3.3 Ipv6: Link-local addresses

PCMX supports link-local addresses in the IPv6-stack.

3.4 SUN conforming Installation Path and Name

To conform to the SUN conventions the install path of the objects has changed to /opt/SMAW/SMAWpcmx. Links exists for programs (/opt/SMAW/bin), daemons (/opt/SMAW/bin), libraries (/opt/SMAW/lib) and header files (/opt/SMAW/include). For compatibility reasons with existing CMX applications also links made to /opt/bin.

If the first time installed on Solaris 10 in global zone the TNS entries are taken from /opt/lib/cmx/DIR1 if exists.

The package name has changed to SMAWpcmx as of V6.0A40.

3.5 Solaris Zone Concept (Solaris 10)

PCMX can be installed in a local zone.

3.5.1 /dev/cmx not Solaris Zone compatible

SMAWpcmx stores now the names for the named pipes for the TNS daemon in /opt/SMAW/SMAWpcmx/lib/cmx.
